Navigation course offered online

For the first time, ABC/ VF will offer the Navigation course (mostly) online, and to a national audience.

This is the second of two courses in celestial navigation. The N course will be offered to members who have successfully completed the Junior Navigation Course (JN).

Once registered for the course students will be given access to extensive materials to review the JN course. The course will require the students to take celestial sights.

To prepare students to

do this there will be one online session to give an overview of the course and to review the sight taking requirements.

Online videos will be available that show how to use the sextant to meet the sight requirements. The students will be <u>required</u> to take their sights during the summer, complete their sight reduc-

tions, and submit their sight folder before the didactic online course begins again in September. No supervision of their sight taking will be necessary, as it was during the JN course.

There are already six students enrolled in N. Please note that this course may be the first USPS course which is open to any qualified student in the nation.

We will limit the enrollment to 20 students. Please let Jim Heckman know if you are interested in taking this course.

Our club will use FreeConferenceCall.com (it really is free) to present meetings, courses and seminars. Please go to this web page (https://www.freeconference-call.com/pdf/us/freeconference-call-us-participant-reference-guide.pdf) to view instructions on how to install it.

When attending any online meeting, course or seminar it is <u>highly</u> recommended that you log in 15 minutes before its scheduled start time, especially if this is the first time you have logged into the session. In this way we can deal with any technical issues

you might have. Experience has shown that those who log in late will disrupt the session.

Login Links and Meeting IDs

The login link and meeting ID will vary

depending on who is running the meeting/course. Most of the educational meetings/courses/seminars will use the information in the boxes below.

<u>Online Etiquette</u>

Log into the meeting 15 minutes before the scheduled start time.

Keep your micro phone muted unless you wish to speak.

Try to keep the background noise to an absolute minimum. Make sure that if the TV is on, the volume is turned all the way down and that there is no one talking in the room.

Do not show the video from your web cam unless the instructor has given you permission.

Do not speak while someone else is speaking. If two or more people are speaking at the same time the result is unintelligible.

If possible, when you wish to ask a question, send a message using the Chat function in FreeConferenceCall.com. If the instructor does not respond, just unmute your mi-

crophone and say "question".

During discussions, wait until the speaker has finished to ask your question or contribute an answer or a comment.

Look for some new Sassafras River navigation aids

Note: The spread of the coronavirus disease has interrupted many projects. It was not immediately apparent whether the two construction projects listed below are affected. Consult the agencies involved for pertinent updates.

Marine construction continues on Poplar

Island with barges continuing to transport dredged fill from the Baltimore area.

Marine construction at the Cambridge Marine Terminal in Cambridge Creek is scheduled to continue until November 30, 2020.

Sassafras River aids updates

The Coast Guard has made changes in the aids marking the Sassafras River. The changes are listed below.

- Sassafras River Channel Lighted Buoy 2 has been converted to Sassafras River Light 2SR in approximate position 39 22 19.700N, 75 59 02.250W with SG dayboards.
- Convert Sassafras River Channel Buoy 3 to Sassafras River Daybeacon 3 in approximate position 39 22 19.700N, 75 59 02.250W with SG dayboards.
- Establish Sassafras Daybeacon 4 in approximate position 39 22 02.890N, 75 58 46.770W with TR dayboards.

- Discontinue Sassafras River Channel Buoy 5.
- Discontinue Sassafras River Channel Buoy 6.
- Relocate Sassafras River Channel Light 7 to 39 22 38.680N, 75 57 50.520W and rename to

Sassafras River Light 5.

- Convert Sassafras River Channel Buoy 8 to Sassafras River Daybeacon 6 in approximate position 39 22 29.650N, 75 57 22.210W with TR dayboards.
- Relocate Sassafras River Channel Light 9 to approximate position 39 22 11.230N, 75 56 33.310W with a flashing 2.5s green light and rename to Sassafras River Light 7.
- Convert Sassafras River Channel Light 10 to Sassafras River Daybeacon 8 in approximate position 39 22 14.010N, 75 55 45.880W.
- Convert Sassafras River Channel Buoy 12 to Sassafras River Light 10 in approximate position 39 21 50.690N, 75 54 43.900W with a flashing 2.5 second red light and TR dayboards.
- Convert Sassafras River Channel Buoy 14 to Sassafras River Daybeacon 12 in approximate position 39 21 54.950N, 75 53 44.670W with TR dayboards.

Sassafras River Facts

- The river is 22 miles long
- Its watershed area is 97 miles, of which 14% is water.
- Several rare and endangered species live in the watershed.

Emergency! Here's how to call

When using your VHF radio to request help, you need to assess the problem. If it is <u>life</u> threatening or your <u>boat is sinking or on fire</u>, you would use "Mayday, Mayday, Mayday" and your vessel's name. This is the same as an SOS.

For other less severe problems, such as you have lost your engine and are adrift in the channel, or a crew member has a broken arm, use "Pan-Pan" three times followed by the vessel name. (Both Mayday and Pan-Pan calls on VHF would alert other boaters nearby as to your problem, allowing them to offer assistance if needed.)

If using DSC (Digital Selective Calling) on your VHF, you should announce whether the problem is a Mayday or Pan-Pan. Remember, if you want to use the DSC feature you need to have registered your radio and received a 9-digit MMSI number identifying you and your vessel.

While you can register for a MMSI number at West Marine, be aware that in that case, your number is limited to the US. I prefer to register with NOAA, which makes it international.

Remember also that when you receive your number, it has to be entered into your radio.



Follow carefully the instructions in your radio manual. If you screw things up, you may have to return to the dealer to get things fixed.

DSC is a great feature that can be used for other things so, again, check your manual. Don't forget to connect the radio to your GPS also, so that if you broadcast an emergency, your location will be broadcast as well.

A little history on emergency calling. The Morse code signal was originally CQD. Some sources say CQD meant "come quick disaster," but others note that in early radio transmissions, CQ was simply a general call, and the D was added for "Distress."

CQD was changed in 1908 to SOS to make the transmission more efficient in Morse code, because • • • • • • is easier to send and decode than • • • • • • • • • • • •

The first recorded emergency use of SOS sent in Morse code was from the Titanic, whose radio operator sent not only CQD but also SOS. This puts SOS in the same category as Mayday — immediate and serious danger. If a less urgent Morse code call is needed, say for ship safety or safety of a person, XXX (-..--.-) would be sent, equivalent to a Pan-Pan.

I know toilet paper is in demand now and supplies are short, but remember to get marine grade or you could have a big emergency and a big cleaning problem.




