Our fall teaching season is concluding. This week Nick Montalto is presenting the last lecture in our Virtual Piloting Course. Four of the initial five students will be taking the exam. We expect to get the results from National in January.

The open book exam challenges the students to deal with common problems that boaters have while navigating in our bays and rivers. The students gave high praise to Russ Jones and Nick Montalto for having presented a wonderful course.

The last online lecture of our Virtual Navigation Course will finish before Christmas. The 15 students in this course come from squadrons

located from South Carolina to Southeast Pennsylvania. Members of ABC-VF, Bill McManimen, Sam Lyness and I have worked with five additional instructors from our D/5.

A requirement for the N course completion is that the students need to use sextants (and a watch) to make observations (take sights) of stars and planets at sunrise and sunset.

The information gathered during those sight-taking sessions must be used in calculations which are reported in a document called the "sight folder." The sight folder is reviewed locally and when satisfactory, is submitted to National for review and approval.

Having taught this course for more than 30 years, I always have some trepidation because of the challenge of encouraging students to finish their sight folders. I am pleased this year because the students are making great progress with their sight folders. Already, a number have been approved by National. In large part, this is because of the hard work (many

The lights are out, but the dredging continues

The Eastport Yacht Club has canceled its annual lighted boat parade scheduled for Dec. 12 due to Covid-19 concerns. There is, however, a lighted boat parade in the harbor of St. Michaels at 6 pm Dec. 12.

As usual the dredging season has begun that will make some of our favorite channels and anchorages more easily accessible for the 2021 boating season. Here are some of the projects on the Bay:

- The much-needed dredging of the Elk River is in progress. Thanks to all who made their thoughts known to the “powers that be” in District 5 Coast Guard headquarters! The dredging started just south of Red Point at 39° 31’ 32.36” N, 75° 52’ 21.54” W to 39° 6’ 13.71” N,

76° 17’ 48.08” W that is just south of Pooles Island.

- The entering channel to Lake Ogelton was dredged between Oct. 15 and Nov. 15.
- Dredging has begun and is expected to continue until Jan. 11 at Brady and Old Glory coves in Stoney Creek in Anne Arundel County.
- Dredging is being conducted in the Bush River north of the railroad bridge near the mouth of Otter Point Creek. The dredging is expected to be completed by March 1, 2021.

Looking for a good walk? A walking trail and bridge are planned for the eastern bank of the Schuylkill River between mile 6.3 and 6.4 of the Schuylkill River Trail.

Argo Nav app: Brand new, full-featured, and FREE



Everybody likes free stuff, and especially when it's useful. In this case, ABCVF members found a lot to like during a Zoom presentation in October of an evolving navigation software called Argo.

The brainchild of Jeff Foulkes of Maryland, Argo is a full-featured app for iOS and Android (no laptop version yet) that offers many of the navigational tools sought by recreational boaters, plus integration with social networking platforms.

It is described on the company website as “a free boating app that helps you find and route to new destinations, share local knowledge, and connect with other boaters. Think of Argo as having a first mate and the local boating community right in your pocket.”

We haven't had a chance to do a full review of the software, but first impressions are very favorable. Argo is available from the Apple App Store, and on Google Play.

New ABC phone and tablet app offers improved options

The other day while looking up something on the USPS.org main site I came across a link that took me to the ABC app site. It seems that this new app has had a major update from the one I had loaded last year. The new app has added many new worthwhile features and is available for Apple and Android operating systems. Plus, it's free.

The main screen has six major folders:


1- MY LOCATION

This will pinpoint exactly where you are and will display your latitude and longitude coordinates (and speed if you are moving). It also allows you to send your coordinates to someone else as a text message or as an e-mail.

2- MY LOG/ FLOAT PLAN**

Here you can store all sorts of information about yourself and boat, like an emergency contact, your DAN number, boat insurance policy and MMSI number. You also can pay your annual dues from here.

** What I really liked about this is that



you can create a FLOAT PLAN and send it to somebody who will be aware of your boating plans, so they would know where you plan to be and when you are expected to return. This information could be extremely important if you run into trouble and do not appear when you indicated you would. You also can log your past trips here.

3- ONLINE INFORMATION

Here you can store your membership information and USPS benefits. You can shop the Ship's Store. Also, you can store upcoming boating events, meetings and class dates here, along with contact information of local squadrons.

4- EMERGENCY

This gives you information on how to call for help on your VHF and information on First Aid and Distress signals.

5- REFERENCES

Here's a good place to find live tide charts, weather radar information and marine safety topics. You can even request a VSC here. You can access the ABC Boating Channel videos.

6- BIENVENIDO

This is the Spanish USPS site.

Carbon monoxide — a danger aboard and at home

Odorless, colorless and tasteless, carbon monoxide gas is often called the “silent killer” because it effectively blocks oxygen delivery to the body, causing a startling number of **[fatalities each year](#)**. Carbon monoxide poisoning deaths can also happen aboard your vessel. Learning how to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning will help keep you safe on the water and at home year round.

Boat engines, cabin heaters, generators and galley stoves can all produce carbon monoxide, with engine and generator exhaust being the most prevalent source. CO fumes can also accumulate in areas away from the exhaust source.

In the absence of a breeze, high CO levels can cause unconsciousness in minutes. Without a carbon monoxide detector onboard, CO is often impossible to detect before it overcomes a victim, who is then too weak to escape or summon help.

Early symptoms

The symptoms of mild CO poisoning can mimic seasickness, colds and flu:

- Nausea, weakness, dizziness or headache
- Ringing ears and watering eyes
- Cherry-red coloring to the skin

Moderate carbon monoxide poisoning can cause

- Lightheadedness or headache

- Drowsiness
- Unconsciousness
- Death

Severe CO poisoning can result in damage to the brain or heart followed by death.

Preventing carbon monoxide poisoning

Prevent CO buildup by regularly checking for leaks in your engine and generator exhaust systems and in the seals around your hatches and portholes. Take the following precautions:

- Check the ventilation of your alcohol stove.
- Maintain your generators meticulously.
- Run your exhaust blowers while using generators.
- Ensure that air flows freely from front to back on a moving boat; avoid the station wagon effect.
- Keep passengers clear of the platform over engine or generator exhaust when running unless there's a strong airflow.
- Be cautious about running engines or generators when anchored, moored, or docked unless there's a substantial breeze; do not run generators overnight when stopped.
- Don't allow anyone in the water to approach within 10 to 20 feet of the engines or generator exhaust.
- Don't tow anyone close to the boat while underway.
- Check stove and other fuel burning de-

Highlights from October and November ExCom meetings


October



vice vents for leaks; keep vents clear.

- Beware of nearby boats with engines or generators running; stay clear or move away.

Install CO alarms in your boat's cockpit, cabin and sleeping areas, and test the alarms regularly. If you already have a CO detector installed, it might be time to [update it to a newer model](#).


