### Shoals and holes — update your charts to show them

**Good news:** Dredging has restored access to some of the gunk holes on the Chesapeake. Here are the ones on the northern Chesapeake:

- Carr's Creek off the Severn River in Annapolis.
- Cattail Creek off the Magothy River.
- Cypress Creek to Shady Side, 39 deg 4 min 22.31 sec N, 76 deg 31 min 32.07 sec W, off of the Magothy River.
- Dogwood Harbor and Tongers Basin on the eastern side of Tilghman Island.
- Parish Creek off of the West River.

"The Lord giveth and The Lord taketh away." These areas are experiencing shoaling:

- St. Peter's Creek from Entrance Light 1 SP to Day Beacon 2.
- Little Choptank River, Slaughter Creek Light
  2 SC and Buoy 6 to Buoy 8.

Shoaling of the Northeast River continues. The fairway has always been narrow and continues to narrow such that the following changes have been proposed. No schedule for the work is currently available, so the prudent boater should make the changes on the appropriate chart and use them for navigation as they are the recommended navigation points.

- Change Susquehanna River Junction Lighted Buoy A to Susquehanna River Junction Light SN.
- Change Northeast River Lighted Buoy 2 to

- Northeast River Light 2 with 2.5-second red light and TR dayboards.
- Change Northeast River Buoy 4 to Northeast River Light 4 with a flashing 4-second red light and TR dayboards.
- Change Northeast River Buoy 5 to Northeast River Lighted Buoy 5 with a flashing 2.5-second green light.
- Relocate Northeast River Lighted Buoy 6 to 39 deg 32 min 36.410 sec N, 76 deg 58 min 22.280 sec W.
- Relocate Northeast River Buoy 7 to 39 deg 33 min 10.414 sec N, 75 deg 58 min 30.304 sec W.
- Change Northeast River Light 8 to Northeast River Lighted Buoy 8 at 39 deg 33 min 41.080 sec N, 75 deg 58 min 19.520 sec W with flashing 2.5-second red light.
- Discontinue Northeast River Buoy 9.
- Change Northeast River Light 10 to Northeast River Lighted Buoy 10 at 39 deg 34 min 21.480 sec N, 75 degrees 57 min 51.090 sec W.
- Discontinue Northeast River Daybeacon 12.
- Discontinue Northeast River Light 14.
- Discontinue Northeast River Buoy 16.
- Discontinue Northeast River Light 17.

Be advised that NOAA electronic navigational chart range lines may not reflect the true location of the range structure.

### Don't be slip-sliding; walk this way to your mailbox or boat

As I was walking out to get the mail the other day, it came to me that one of the most dangerous places you can go this winter might be to your own mailbox. It had rained a bit, and the temperature had dropped to near freezing. Though I could not be sure, I suspected that my path to the mailbox could be slippery. In the

winter, simply walking to the mailbox can be very dangerous.

I consider myself an expert on safe winter walking. I have worked many shifts in a tiny emergency room in the Alaska Bush, most of it in the dead of winter, and I always walked to and from the hospital. The route is on unimproved dirt roads and tundra. In good weather it takes about 30 minutes. But when it is icy, that walk is nerve wracking, downright dangerous, and could take twice as long.

How best do we remain safe while simply walking in winter?

The single most important thing you can do is to wear appropriate footgear. Lace-up boots or shoes with grippy rubber or neoprene composite soles are best. Lace them up tight so your feet don't slide inside the shoe.

Slip-on foul weather sailing boots, or shoes with slick leather or plastic soles are not safe in icy conditions. I don't know how many times I have been told, as I was setting a fractured arm or suturing a lacerated forehead in an emergency room, "I was just going to check the mailbox. It was only going to take a second so I threw on my bedroom slippers."

Dedicate yourself to safely getting to your destination. Put away the cell phone. Do not carry anything in your arms; use a backpack to keep your arms free. Keep your hands out of your pockets; you may need them for balance or to break a fall. Better to land on an outstretched arm than on your head.

Adopt an athlete's stance: Bend slightly forward at the waist. Keep your stance wide, feet about shoulder width apart with your knees slightly bent. Hold your arms slightly out from your sides to help keep you stable and maintain

balance if one foot should slip. You should look much like a baseball shortstop or football linebacker ready for action.

Avoid walking heel-toe as you normally would. Instead, use more of a shuffling, slow, purposeful gait keeping your feet flat, increasing your contact with the ground. Keep your body weight directly over the foot that is in full contact with the ground. When negotiating stairs, use hand rails if available. And wear gloves or mittens to protect your hands if you do fall.

Before getting out of your car, open the door and look where you are about to step. If you see ice or slick spots, consider moving your car to a better location. When walking near traffic, be sure that your scarf and hat do not muffle sounds.

Give yourself plenty of extra time; you do not want to be in a hurry when it's slippery out.

Remember these tips when you check your boat in the boat yard or at the dock. Always wear a life jacket when down on the dock this winter and know where the ladder is to get out of the water in hurry if you accidentally slip and go in.

Be safe while walking this winter even if you're just walking to check the mailbox.

I am creating several animations as part of a group developing six online Boat Handling seminars.


Each seminar will have a student guide, a narrated PowerPoint and a discussion session with different scenarios.




At left, aerial view of three boats swinging at anchor in a tight cove. At right, the view from the helm of the red boat as it rotates.

### Briefly Noted



**Space Force logo** — CNN reports that the new U.S. Space Force logo seems to boldly go where one logo has gone before.

President Trump posted an image on Twitter of the insignia for the newest branch of the U.S. military, drawing immediate comparisons of the new logo to the "Star Trek" Starfleet Starship duty insignia. The logo is also similar to the insignia of the Air Force Space Command, which was the precursor to the Space Force, hosting 16,000 active duty airmen and civilians.

A Space Force spokesperson confirmed in a statement that the seal, chosen and unveiled by Trump is, in fact, the new official logo.

"The U.S. Space Force seal honors the Department of the Air Force's proud history and long-standing record of providing the best space capabilities in the world," the spokesperson said. "The delta symbol, the central design element in the seal, was first used as early as 1942 by the U.S. Army Air Forces; and was used in early Air Force space organization emblems dating back to 1961."

### 50 years of boating adventures

James Affleck of Gladwyne was recognized for a half century of membership in the Main Line Sail and Power Squadron (now America's Boating Club® Valley Forge) at our annual holiday party. He and his wife, Sally, both avid boaters, attended.

Later Jim reflected on some of their experiences. Following are excerpts from what he wrote. The full text is on our web page at <a href="http://mainlinesps.org/affleck.aspx">http://mainlinesps.org/affleck.aspx</a>.

My family and I have had boats since around 1950; first at Neshaminy Creek, and since 1963 at Duffy Creek Marina in Georgetown, MD.

It was a cold rainy day on Memorial Day weekend 1963 when I wrote my first check for a small cabin boat. That proved to be good practice for the hundreds, if not thousands, of checks I have since written for boats, dockage, electricity, parts, oil, gasoline, batteries, boat clubs, marine apparel, sandpaper, paint, tools, diesel fuel, entertainment, and more.

The first of several wood boats was a 20-foot open boat with an inboard motor which served as a good "learning" boat. Partly made of oak, the boat was seaworthy. A later boat was a 21-foot Chris Craft kit, largely plywood. It was not the strongest boat, but we cruised the upper Chesapeake and the Jersey Shore in it. Later we acquired a dual engine 38-foot Chris Craft, and cruised the middle and upper Bay.

In 1983 we bought a Chris Craft houseboat. It was not especially seaworthy but had many conveniences -- dishwasher, washer, dryer, on-demand generator, garbage disposal, air conditioning and heat. It sank at its slip one winter, was eventually restored, then sold. Then we bought a wonderful 55-foot Chris Craft, which was a lot of work. We also had a diesel-powered sailboat, and raised the sails several times.

About 10 years ago we bought a 36-foot Sea Ray Express, which is much easier to maintain.

While cruising was fun, we also enjoyed the challenge of maintenance, accruing an array of tools and parts. Now we cruise a lot less and my desire to per-



form maintenance on anything has waned.

We also were fortunate to have several smaller boats to use for swimming in the Sassafras River. "Swimming" is a nautical expression which involves walking in the water, drinking wine, eating hors d'oeuvres and generally getting ready for dinner. Very little actual swimming is involved.

Many rules and procedures have changed in our boating years. In an early Coast Guard class it was suggested to puncture soda and beer cans at both ends so the cans would sink. In rough water the textbook suggested hanging an open oil can over the bow so the film of oil would prevent waves from breaking. My boats were not large enough to hang 55-gallon oil drums over the bow so we were unable to employ this procedure. Heads were direct discharge.

We were fortunate to go on several MLSPS cruises with our children and their friends. They were all fun but never without some problems. One involved a trip to the Red Eye Grill at Kent Narrows where my son and his best friend, Minshall Painter, ate so many shrimp and crabs that the grill gave up its all you-can-eat policy.

I always enjoyed the Christmas dinners which reviewed the many cruise events that had gone awry; nearly everyone won an award for something. Some were the equivalent of a six-way tie for the seventh runner-up for the most awkward event.

We have been on a number of trips to South Carolina and Florida. Our remaining boating days will be largely restricted to the Sassafras River.


