





Be alert for missing nav lights and lots of athletes

Below are problems with the navigational aids in our usual cruising area:

Some lights are a factor too. As the hours of daylight decrease, these are the nav light problems in our area.

There will be construction and use of the Annapolis Harbor boat show piers until Oct. 19.

On Saturday, Oct. 7, plan your boating and driving in the Bay area carefully. Ironman Maryland, also known as Chesapeakeman, is happening that day. About 2,000 swimmers are expected to be competing in a 2.4-mile open water swim between 0600 and 1100 in the Choptank River between Great Marsh Park and the Cambridge Yacht Club. Coast Guard and other patrol vessels will be in control of the area. They may be contacted on VHF Channel 16 for necessary communications.

The Ironman competition continues with a 112-mile bike ride through the Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge and on area roads, and a 26.2 mile marathon that concludes in Cambridge.

Then, on the weekend of Nov. 4 and 5, look for lots of traffic on both sides of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge, especially in Annapolis and Stevensville. The eastbound span of the bridge will be closed to traffic for a while on Sunday morning, Nov. 5, when thousands of runners and walkers will be participating in the Across the Bay 10K. That Sunday is the only day of the year the bridge is open to pedestrians and closed to vehicles — plan accordingly.


