P/C Bobbie Doughty

Barbara Jean "Bobbie" Doughty, age 91, who was the commander of Main Line Sail and Power Squadron in 1997-98, passed away in February at her home in Phoenixville. She was the wife of the late Frederic C. Doughty, who had been a squadron commander in 1994-95.

Bobbie and Fred got married in 1952 in Florida and then settled in Pennsylvania. They lived for nearly 50 years on Valley Forge Mountain. They both enjoyed boating, and both attained the rank of AP* (Advanced Piloting plus additional courses). When Bobbie joined the boating community, women were not admitted as full members, so she joined the Mainstays. Later she gained full membership in what was then the Main Line Power Squadron.

"Bobbie was always a class act!" wrote Past Commander Chuck Pellegrini on her obituary tribute wall. "I followed her as the Commander of the Main Line Power Squadron.



She was a large part of any success I had as Commander. She was a gracious lady who was always willing to help and share advice. I miss her and her gentle smile. RIP, my friend and mentor!"

She participated in many aspects of the squadron, and received several awards and honors for her service.

Bobbie is survived by her two children, Denise R., wife of Harold Cheney, and Frederic C. Doughty; and many nieces and nephews. There will be a graveside remembrance sometime in the spring.

Membership Best Practices

Research and outreach of the TOP 5 Squadrons by total members and the Top 5 growing squadrons by percentage

I'm taking a number of steps to grow membership which include researching all of the power squadrons in the country for the top five in number of total members and the top five and the total greatest growth per squadron in the country. To this end I'm looking for what they're doing to create such success and trying to mirror the efforts that they've done and also come up with some new ideas based on what they tell me.

I had the honor of talking to Barbara Wolfe who is the commander of the Sarasota power squadron. Sarasota power squadron is the second largest power squadron in the country which has 450 members. I asked Barbara how they were building and sustaining the membership and involvement in the group to be able to sustain such a high number of members. She told me there was a combination of holding specific events around the boating types she also mentioned that they have a jumpstart program assigned to a boating rental or boating rental club.

They are networked with other boating type groups such as fishing groups and in fact they have 60 specific members that are just local fishermen with you know local boats. There are 40 members that are specifically kayakers and they have their own events throughout the area. She says they have a newsletter that goes out to 900 people on a weekly basis she says they get a number of members each year from those additional 450 people that are not members but want to know about the squadron and the events that they currently hold.

To keep track of all of the events and notifications to make let people know that things are going on they use a texting program that they can load in the events and it'll go out to everyone's phone and remind them of what's going on as she says that there's a lot of they're very busy schedules with people and the best way is to use the texting program for that she says.



When it comes to e-mail they use MailChimp to make sure that the newsletter gets out to all the folks they also turn around and e-mail out a specifically designed birthday card for everyone when their birthday their actual birthday all in an effort to make everyone feel included and special.

I let her know of some of the things that we were doing in order to help build our membership including getting ourselves lined up with a boat dealer that would pay for the boating class of everyone that bought a boat from them.

I also let her know that I am intend to network with a group calledfishbrain.com which is made-up of over 15 million members nationwide that enjoy fishing and the group actually outlines all the hot fishing spots and all the waterways and lakes and rivers across the country. We will have to buy a membership to the fishbrain.com that will give us the ability to network with all of their different subgroups within their 15 million members and also potentially put out notice as to what's going on there.

Barbara really didn't even know about that group and sees that as a new avenue for her group to help build membership and also help the members that are already currently fishermen be able to get to the fishing hotspots better.

I told her about our parade and how we are going out with you know we did it parade last year and she thought that was a great idea.
